

Radio Havana Cuba condemns acts of vandalism against busts of Jose Marti

Havana, January 14 (RHC)-- Radio Habana Cuba has condemned the recent acts of vandalism in Havana against busts of National Hero José Martí, by counterrevolutionaries who tried to damage his image on January 1st of this year.

In an act of atonement for these actions, the workers of the international radio station highlighted the legacy of José Martí, and the importance of Martí's ideology in the Cuban revolutionary process.
