US election 2020: More Democrats throw hat in the Ring

A year before the start of the important primaries in the United States more Democrats have announced their candidacy.

The members of Congress Tulsi Gabbard, the two years ago, through a Meeting with the Syrian leader Bashar al-Assad made headlines, told the television channel CNN, you compete. On Saturday, the former housing Minister Julián Castro followed.

Tulsi Gabbard, who is sitting for Hawaii in the house of representatives said it will announce its decision formally next week. As the Central political concern of the 37-Year-old called the access to health care, a Reform of the criminal law, and climate issues.

Gabbard, in the face of military interventions, dismissive, and even veteran, had met in January 2017 with Assad, as they stayed for a week in Syria and Lebanon. For the Meeting with the international outlaw President Gabbard has been criticized by many.

Julián Castro, who was among Barack Obama's Secretary of housing and urban development, announced his

candidacy on Saturday at a gig in his home town of San Antonio in Texas. The 44-Year-old said it was time for “new leadership and new energy”. He announced that, in the event of an electoral victory as the first official act of the re-entry of the United States in the Paris climate agreement to initiate.
