

Fidel sends letter to Nicolás Maduro

The images of those who expressed there the sentiments of a people who want and deserve to live, are unforgettable and constitute a message of peace. The memory of Hugo Chávez was present throughout.

Still touched by such unforgettable memories, I send you a strong embrace which I ask you to transmit to your delegation and your brave people.
