
Raul Castro Receives the President of Equatorial Guinea

The President of the Cuban Councils of State and Ministers, Raul Castro Ruz, met in Monday afternoon with Teodoro Obiang Nguema Mbasogo, his counterpart from the Republic of Equatorial Guinea, who is on an official visit to the Caribbean nation.

In a cordial atmosphere, the two leaders highlighted the fraternal relations between the two countries and ratified the willingness to continue strengthening and diversifying cooperation bonds.
