

Lionel Richie to play Glastonbury in 2015

The former Commodores star, whose hits include All Night Long, Dancing on the Ceiling and Hello, is the first artist confirmed for the 2015 event.

"We are over the moon," said festival co-organiser Emily Eavis, daughter of Glastonbury founder Michael.

"We felt very lucky to get the call from a true Motown legend asking to play next year," she continued.

"He's got so many amazing songs, to see him perform here on the farm is just going to be wonderful."

Richie said he was "really excited to play Glastonbury next year as it's one of the most iconic festivals in the world".

"It has a phenomenal history and the alumni of artists who have previously played is incredible so I'm honoured to be joining that club.

"It will be a really special moment for me and I can't wait to share it with everyone," the 65-yearold continued.

"I can now say 'Yes, I'm playing Glastonbury'."



Richie, who has sold more than 100 million records worldwide, announced earlier this year he would be touring the UK in 2015.

His 28 June set on Glastonbury's famed Pyramid stage will mark the US singer's first UK festival appearance.

Country star Dolly Parton played the Sunday teatime slot at this year's festival, following in the footsteps of such acts as Neil Diamond, Dame Shirley Bassey and Sir Tom Jones.

Tickets for next year's event at Worthy Farm in Somerset sold out in less than 30 minutes, before any acts on the line-up had been announced.
