
MSC Cruises to send second ship to Cuba

MSC Armonia will join MSC Opera, which is already sailing Caribbean itineraries from Havana this winter, making MSC the first global cruise line to homeport in the Cuban capital.

Demand for MSC Opera cruises has been so high that the ship will remain in Havana next winter when MSC Armonia arrives.

A typical seven-night cruise from Havana to Montego Bay in Jamaica calls at Georgetown the capital of the Cayman Islands, where its British colonial history is still apparent at Fort George and at the National Museum – although many people will prefer visiting the famous Seven Mile Beach or snorkeling at the Cali shipwreck site near town.

Cruises also call at Cozumel, a Mexican island with great scuba diving and snorkeling with dolphins, manatees and sea turtles in the Chankanaab eco park.

The highlight of these itineraries, though, will be several days in Havana itself – famous for its UNESCO-listed Old Quarter.

“With no less than nine UNESCO World Heritage Sites, and a long-held tradition of hospitality, Cuba has all the makings of a top world cruise destination,” says MSC Cruises Chief Executive Officer Gianni Onorato.
