
Raul Castro attends swearing-in ceremony of new Cuban ambassadors

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Raul Castro, president of Cuba's Council of State and Ministers, presided over the swearing-in ceremony of new Cuban ambassadors at the Jose Marti Memorial.

According to the ACN, other members of the Political Bureau like Esteban Lazo Hernandez, president of the National Assembly of People's Power, and Bruno Rodriguez Parrilla, Minister of Foreign Affairs, attended the ceremony.
